Earthquakes are rupturing processes in the Earth's crust that lead to vibrations on the surface layer of the planet. Most of the damaging earthquakes so far have been tectonic in origin (tectonic quakes). They are caused by a sudden displacement along a fracture face in the Earth's crust and by the resulting release of accumulated elastic energy.

Earthquakes. An earthquake is the result of a release of stored energy in the Earth's crust that creates seismic waves. Seismographs are machines that detect and measure seismic waves caused by earthquakes. P waves, or primary seismic waves, are the fastest moving waves. They travel through solids, liquids and gases.
